Beaches





Bandar Jissah beach

Set within a beautiful amphitheater of honey coloured sea cliffs, the beach at Bandar Jissah is one of the most attractive in Oman. Less than 15 minutes by boat from Marina Bandar Rowdah in Muscat, the rugged mountains create an atmosphere of rural isolation. Small coral reefs lie against the small islands off the beach to tempt swimmers, while the bay is a popular boating destination. Stretching away behind the beach, the wadi is one of Muscat's prime mixed-use development of hotels and fashionable housing.



Qantab beach

Overlooked by cliffs rising steeply to 100 meters above the sea, the beach of Qantab fishing village is a popular leisure destination in Muscat. Clustered on the beach and anchored offshore, small motors boats are available for hire to enjoy the scenic coastline of Muscat 'old city', which is 20 minutes away by sea. Farther along the beach, at its western end, is a small traditional boat construction facility where the famous 'Jewel of Muscat' was hand-built.



Yiti beach

Beyond the small village of Yiti, its inviting sandy beach stretches along the Sea of Oman for almost a kilometer. The route is a comfortable drive of about 14 kilometers after turning south at the roundabout near Shangri-La's Barr Al Jissah Resort & Spa. Here, the road cuts through the honey colored mountains, and after turning south at a further roundabout, eventually loops north through Yiti village beside the creek. Rugged cliffs gaze down on a scattered woodland of acacia trees, and beyond them an azure sea invites swimmers into its warm waters. This beach is home to ghost crabs, while western reef heron and sooty gulls are usually found just on the tide line.





Bandar Al Khiran

The calm waters and low hills of Bandar Al Khiran includes a remarkable variety of nature, making it a place that can be returned to innumerable times while still enjoying a different experience. Covering an area of 9 square kilometers, sun seekers are tempted by sandy beaches, birding enthusiasts can scan mangrove-fringed mud flats and scuba divers may drop in on over a dozen scuba diving sites, including a wreck just offshore. Bandar Al Khiran can be reached after turning south at the roundabout near Shangri-La's Barr Al Jissah Resort & Spa. Continue south at a further roundabout to drive west across the wadi before Yiti and skirting around the village's schools carry on past Hanshift Village and Khor Yanket before arriving, after a scenic drive of some 17 kilometers, at Bandar Al Khiran.



Sifah Beach

Through a delightfully twisty road in some of the more varied mountains near Muscat, Sifah Beach is less than 35 kilometers from the roundabout near Shangri-La's Barr Al Jissah Resort & Spa, and just under an hour by boat from Marina Bandar Rowdah. Stretching for almost 10 kilometers with the village of Sifah as its central pivot, the beach is an increasingly popular leisure destination with the stylish Jabal Sifah Resort at its southern end. Sit and enjoy the views over its Marina, or enjoy lunch overlooking the white sand and sparkling waters of the Sea of Oman.





Yanket Beach

The deep fjord-like creek at Yanket extends 2 kilometers inland from the Sea of Oman creating a unique inlet around 25 kilometers drive from Al Hamriyah Roundabout. Yanket's beach is home to a football pitch, which periodically disappears under the advancing tide that the adjacent boats use to escape to sea.

The best way to visit this creek is by boat, as the 25 minutes journey from Marina Bandar Rowdah will reward you with a close view of grey herons and occasional cormorants fishing from the base of the steep cliffs.





Al Seeb Beach

For around 7 kilometers, the beach at Al Seeb offers a workplace and leisure area for the residents of Al Seeb and beyond. About halfway along its length, the modern fishing harbour with its fish market provides constant interest, as boats dash in with the catch of the day. Early risers can see horses from the nearby Royal Stables being exercised, while as the sun disappears over the western horizon teams finish their game of beach football. Along the entire length, a paved promenade allows comfortable walks to enjoy the sparkling blue sea and take in some invigorating sea air.



Qurum Beach

Stretching west from the headland under the Crowne Plaza Hotel to beyond the Grand Hyatt, Qurum Beach is a broad expanse of pale sand that provides a superb area for relaxation in Muscat. The eastern section, near the mangrove trees, offers shelters for picnics and a few boats for trips out to sea. Several restaurants overlook the beach, their food and ambience are enhanced by panoramic views out to sea. This road is a favourite place to enjoy the sight of luxury cars as they cruise through this area. Past the Intercontinental Hotel, the promenade allows families to enjoy picnics overlooking the beach, or eat in the fashionable area of Jawharat Al Shatti. The beach itself has designated areas which are used for football or families to relax in.



Azaiba beach

With the public garden of Azaiba Park to the west and a small creek to the east, the beach at Al Azaiba extends for 4 kilometers along the Sea of Oman. The beach is less busy than other beaches in Muscat and is ideal for families to relax in.





Damaniyat Islands

Spread like a string of pearls in the Sea of Oman, the archipelago of the Damaniyat Islands just over 50 kilometers north-west of Muscat, is an important nature reserve. With more than 11 islands and healthy hard and soft corals, these Islands are an increasingly popular scuba diving location, either from Muscat or the Sawadi area on the coast. In midsummer whale sharks feed in the nutrient rich waters and throughout the year sea turtles, moray eels, stingrays, leopard and reef sharks, and an extraordinary variety of fish contribute to a location that draws divers time and time again.



White Beach

Overlooked by the towering escarpment of Al Hajar Ash Sharqi mountain range is the beautiful bay 'White Beach', about 4 kilometres by a track south of Fins village on the coastal road between Sur and Quriyat. The sand, formed from ancient coral reef, is lapped by the clear turquoise water of the Sea of Oman creating one of the area's most relaxing locations. These sub-tropical waters allow comfortable swimming for much of the year where, below the cliffs of low headland just to the north of the beach, you will enjoy the company of some of Oman's abundant fish.

Forts and Castles





AL Jalali and Al Mirani Forts

The twin forts of Al Jalali and Al Mirani share the same proximity to Al Alam Palace in old Muscat and have had each other's company for over 400 years. Though the origins of both are older, they were re-built in 1588 by the Portuguese after a Turkish siege. Al Jalali Fort, to the east, has a substantial gun platform with 8 British ships cannon of the early 19th century. The complex of rooms above the stairs from the harbour includes a small mosque and museum with a 'son et lumie're' presentation of firearms and Omani metalwork. The western Fort Al Mirani's principal function today is as a barracks, accessed by an elevator concealed in the most prominent tower in the fort. As the forts are within the Palace, they do not open for the public.



Matrah fort

Prominently located overlooking Port Sultan Qaboos, Matrah Fort dates from the years after 1622 when the Portuguese were expelled from Hormuz Island and made Muscat their principal regional port. The fort protected what was the fortified trading centre of Matrah, just west of the main entrance to Matrah Souq and also the entrance to the sheltered bay.

Quriyat Fort

The current fort at Quriyat dates from the early 19th century, though one stood in Quriyat during the centuries before. Located in the market square within Quriyat's town centre, the fort is a single-story building facing towards the sea. Grouped around an open courtyard, the rooms are domestic rather than military in use, and include a gallery to allow residents to enjoy a cool sea breeze while relaxing in the shade. Overlooking the entrance to the fort, a single canon tower is the building's principal defence.



Al Seerah Tower

One of the fortifications built by the Portuguese after their arrival in Oman, Al Seerah Tower guards the access into the adjacent lagoon at Quriyat. Today, the new fishing harbour and the adjacent Al Seerah Park are overlooked by this much photographed tower.



Bait Al Maqham fort

Bait al Maqham was the home of a lady, Sayyida Thuria bint Mohammed bin Azzan, of Oman's ruling family. Just under 5 kilometers south of junction 6 on Muscat's Expressway, this 19th century fort is an impressive three-story building overlooking the Date plantations and oasis in Bowsher. Climbing to the upper floors, you will see the private apartments and be rewarded with great views down the wadi and over the date plantations.

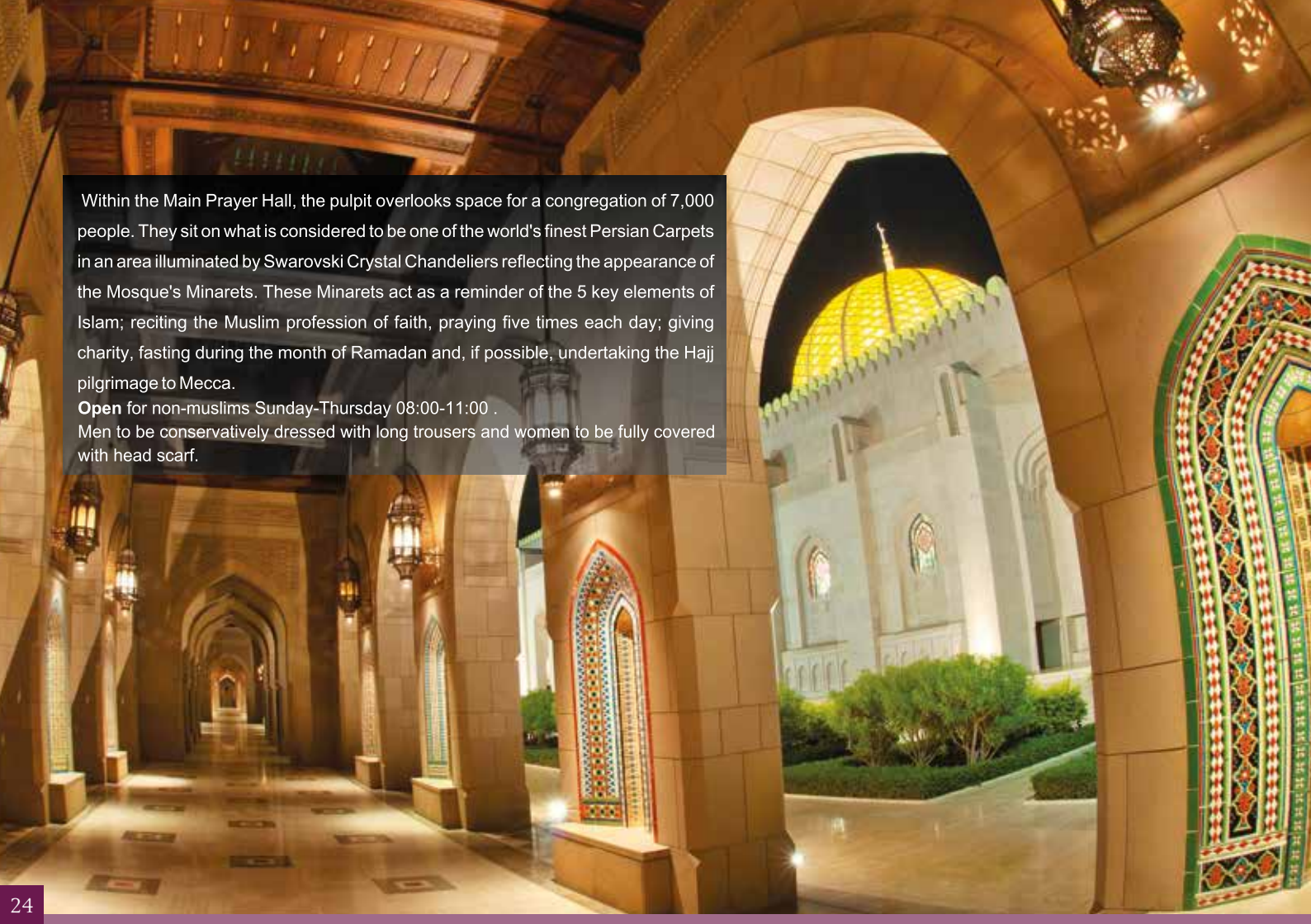

Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque

Oman's principal place of worship the Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque has been created using superlative craftsmanship and the finest material. The buildings, located just south of Sultan Qaboos Road in Ghubra, is on an east-west axis towards the Qibla in Mecca. Entered through the formal gardens on its eastern perimeter, the building is set on an elevated podium, as is the case with the majority of traditional mosques in Oman. There are 3 main prayer areas in the complex; the Ladies Prayer Hall, an Inner 'Sahn' (courtyard) and the Main Prayer Hall.

Within the Main Prayer Hall, the pulpit overlooks space for a congregation of 7,000 people. They sit on what is considered to be one of the world's finest Persian Carpets in an area illuminated by Swarovski Crystal Chandeliers reflecting the appearance of the Mosque's Minarets. These Minarets act as a reminder of the 5 key elements of Islam; reciting the Muslim profession of faith, praying five times each day; giving charity, fasting during the month of Ramadan and, if possible, undertaking the Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca.

Open for non-muslims Sunday-Thursday 08:00-11:00 .

Museums





Bait Al Zubair Museum

Housing a collection which includes traditional Omani silver jewellery, female and male costumes and household utensils, the Bait Al Zubair Museum complex offers an intriguing insight into not only Oman's cultural heritage but also its rapidly developing artistic milieu. Centered on the original purpose built 'Bait Al Bagh' some 500 meters south-west of The Palace, the collection has grown through 4 separate buildings, each with its own focus.

Bait Muzna Art Gallery

Opposite Bait Al Zubair in old Muscat is doorway that opens into the creative world inside the Bait Muzna Art Gallery. Spread over 2 floors in one of the older houses in Muscat's old town, the gallery has a collection that is dramatically enhanced several times a year with exhibitions of artists from Oman and the region.

Muscat Gate Museum

Hundreds of cars pass under one of Muscat's most photographed museum's each day, the Muscat Gate Museum. With its distinctive natural stone cladding, the building is both a formal entrance into Muscat from the town of Matrah and a key to understanding Muscat and its development. Before you enter old Muscat, enjoy this museum's informative displays so that you will appreciate the sights you will see.

Omani French Museum

Located a few hundred meters south-west of The Palace in old Muscat, the Omani French Museum is housed in a traditional late 18th century mansion that was the home and office of the French Consul in the late 19th century. The superb exhibits focus on not just the relations between Oman and France, but also the broader picture of Oman's history over the last 3 centuries. Though the displays are excellent, the building itself with its small garden will also leave a lasting impression on any visitor.

Bait Al Falaj Museum

Since it was rebuilt in 1845, the whitewashed fort of Bait Al Falaj has been a military fort, a residence and administration for Muscat's first airport. Around 21 kilometers south-west of Port Sultan Qaboos, the fort today is an atmospheric museum recounting Oman's history from a military perspective. On two floors, surrounding an open courtyard and within the grounds outside, equipment from Oman's armed forces is displayed. Aircraft ejector seats, tanks and even ships contribute to this special museum.

Open Sunday-Thursday 08:00-13:30 Saturday 09:00-12:00 15:00-18:00 and admission fees apply.



Bait Al Baranda Museum

At the northern end of Matrah's seafront Al Bahri Road, Bait Al Baranda Museum covers the spread of the history of Muscat and its region. A prominent merchant built the original house in the early 20th century, its current name coming from the substantial veranda over its main entrance, which originally overlooked the sea. The atmosphere of the original home has been retained, though its new inhabitants, which include a roaring dinosaur and holograms recounting the impression of visitors to Muscat over the centuries, were never original guests. The museum's entrance area has insights into Oman's UNESCO registered Falaj water systems, and is also used for changing exhibitions that have included works by Salvador Dali.

The Planetarium

The Planetarium in Qurm is a 180 degree 11 meter space, designed to immerse visitors in the extraordinary sights of the Universe. Located less than 2 kilometers by road east of Seih Al Maleh Roundabout on the Qurm Heights Road this is a centrally located facility . With its modern presentation system and a wide range of activities to enhance understanding of the solar system and beyond, this is an ideal experience for everyone.

Open for public presentations on the first Saturday of the month – pre booking is essential. In English 09:00-10:00, in Arabic 10:30-11:30 and 12:00-13:00. All shows have translation headphones. Private shows by appointment.



Bait Adam Museum

One of the more personal museums in Oman, Bait Adam Museum represents the private collection of its owner and curator. The collection includes traditional Omani jewellery, etchings and maps about Oman. What sets this museum apart is that it is very much a family endeavour; interactions with the curator or private meals within the building offer a unique insight into Oman.

Oman Natural History Museum

The vast skeleton of a sperm whale is one of a range of native species displayed in Oman's Natural History Museum. Surrounding the museum's buildings are gardens with native plants of Oman, including the fabled Frankincense Tree. Inside the building the stuff of legend continues with what is believed to have been the basis for the legend of the unicorn, the Arabian oryx. The museum, just north of the Sultan Qaboos Road, includes excellent displays of Oman's biomes and the flora and fauna that inhabit them.

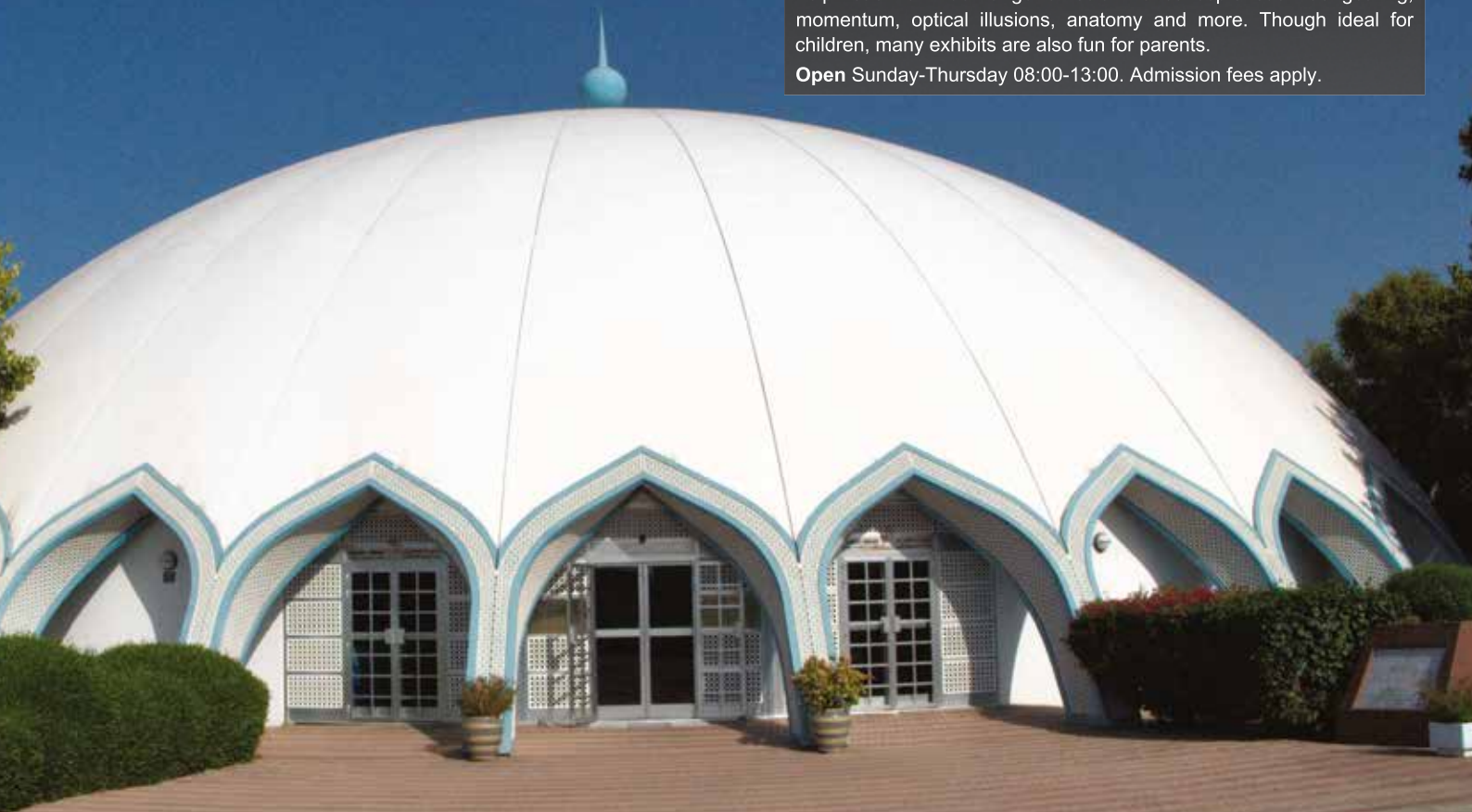
Visit the Museum to gain insights into many of Oman's more elusive inhabitants. Natural History Museum opens Sunday-Thursday 09:30-13:30

Children`s Museum

Housed in a distinctive white dome, the Children's Museum is set just north of Sultan Qaboos Road in Qurm. With interactive exhibits that can help teach a wide range of scientific concepts such as gearing, momentum, optical illusions, anatomy and more. Though ideal for children, many exhibits are also fun for parents.

Wadis





Wadi Dayqah

One of the largest wadis in Oman, Wadi Dayqah flows from the Sharqiyah region from Wadi Dima wa Tayyin, through the Eastern Hajar Mountains and on to the coast just south of Quriyat at Daghmar. The large water catchment has enabled what is probably the largest dam in Arabia to be constructed. The dam has reduced flooding, increased the supply of irrigation water and acts as a buffer water supply for Muscat. Some 30 kilometers by road southwest of Quriyat, the dam with its public park and leisure facilities overlook water of innumerable shades of blue, creating one of Muscat's most popular leisure destinations during holiday periods.



Wadi Al Arbiean

Hidden away deep within the mountains about 50 kilometers by road south of Quriyat, Wadi Al Arbiean is one of the most rewarding wadis to visit in Oman, yet it is one of the least visited. Steep sided mountains with convoluted rock strata overlook small villages with date plantations. A permanent flow of water from the Eastern Hajar Mountains has created several pools of water that act as water storage facilities for the date plantations downstream. The wadi junction at Hail Al Qawasim offers several scenic treks through the area where the scenery can be enjoyed at first hand.



Mazare Village

Lined with extensive date plantations, the wadi through Mazare village was for millennia gouged by flooding through Wadi Dayqah. Today Wadi Dayqah Dam has controlled the water, prevented frequent flood damage and provided a constant water supply within the village. Some 30 kilometers by road southwest of Quriyat, this charming wadi is easy to reach. The gently terraced fields grow date, papaya and banana while in the wadi, pools of water are home to a variety of fish, which are hunted by a number of grey heron and small wading birds.

Parks



Kalboo Park

Half way between Matrah and Muscat is Muscat's most picturesque park, Kalboo. Overlooked by impressive mountains and itself overlooking the sea, this park is a delightful place to visit in the late afternoon to enjoy the tranquillity of Matrah as the sun sets. Grass areas are ideal for picnics while a paved promenade of just under a kilometre encourages you to enjoy the sights. Just outside the park gates, a small beach in the sheltered Kalboo bay is used for easy swimming and snorkelling to see the fish along the park's western edge. Kalboo Park **opens** from 11:00-23:00 – entrance is free.





Sahwa Park

Just west of one of Oman's most recognizable monuments 'Burj Al Sahwa' is Sahwa Park. With its beautiful domed pavilion and sunken gardens, this ornamental park is a delight to the eye. The lake surrounding the pavilion features fountains whose computer controlled display adds a splash to any visit.



Qurum Natural Park

Qurum Natural Park, the largest park in Muscat, enjoys an extraordinary diverse range of attractions and is easily reached, north of Seih Al Maleh Roundabout on the Qurum Heights Road. At its heart is a landscaped garden making use of existing mature trees, such as Ghaf. The plentiful supply of sub-surface water from the adjacent Wadi Adai maintains the verdant appearance that is so unusual in Oman's desert climate. Leisure facilities include a boating pond and children's funfair that draws families on the weekend. On the Park's southwest edge, a substantial amphitheatre hosts live performances including popular music concerts and children's quiz shows. Though not included in the park, the adjacent mangrove area is excellent for bird watching, adding to the wide appeal of the area.

Qurum Natural Park opens from 11:00-23:00 – entrance is free.

Lake Park

West of the small town of Daghamar, just 10 kilometers east of Quriyat, the Lake Park has been created overlooking a small creek. Shelters allow family picnics, while birdwatchers will enjoy spotting a variety of species including kingfisher, grey heron and greenshank.



Souqs



Souq Matrah

The labyrinthine passages, exotic aromas and vivid colours draw visitors to explore the enchantment that Matrah Souq offers. Spreading along the coastal Al Bahri Road for 600 meters and inland to the location of Matrah's original gateway Bab Al Kabir, the souq offers an extraordinary variety of experiences. Below Matrah Fort, the wholesale market's vendors sell exotic bales of fabrics to tempt the fashionable ladies dressing for a wedding as well as vast cauldrons to prepare the wedding feast to satisfy all the guests. South of the main entrance on Al Bahri Road, the fragrance of perfumes and frankincense will tempt visitors to return home with a scent to remind them, and their friends, of Oman. Farther to the west, seek out the iconic Khanjar, the Omani men's ceremonial silver dagger, or to use with your frankincense choose an intricate silver Majmar burner.

Many shops will open 09:00-13:00 & 16:00-21:00

Saturday – Thursday.

In Friday they are only opening during the afternoon.





Matrah fish souq

At the western limit of the Al Bahri Road is the complex of buildings, which houses Matrah's popular fish souq. The buildings though modern in function and appearance, also are at ease with the elements of traditional buildings in Oman. Each morning, the buildings come alive as the inshore fishermen bring their catch for sale. Look for the silver of long-tail tuna and kingfish, the yellow of the Indo-Pacific sergeant major fish, and blue of the Gulf parrotfish. The fish souq is best visited early morning between 06:00-09:00.



Matrah Gold Souq

The western area of Matrah Souq is the traditional location for Muscat's Gold Souq. Gold in Oman is typically 21-carat or higher, with faceted designs to reflect the light. Walking past the gold shops can often give the impression of walking along a continual wall of gold. Customers may include brides and their families, all eager to enjoy the pleasure of choosing some treasured pieces. Spend your time deciding on the design that's right for you and, if you wish, ask for a personal piece created especially to your style.



Souq Al Seeb

With a shop for every need, the Souq at Al Seeb is full of activity from dawn to dusk. The greatest density of shops extends along Wadi Al Bahayis Street, just south of the fisheries harbour. Traditional medicine sellers and hardware stores are full of unexpected goods, while the wafting fragrance of the latest perfume from Paris tries to compete with the eternally popular aroma of Frankincense. Many shops will open 09:00-13:00 & 16:00-21:00 Saturday – Thursday. On Friday, they are only open during the afternoon.

Other places



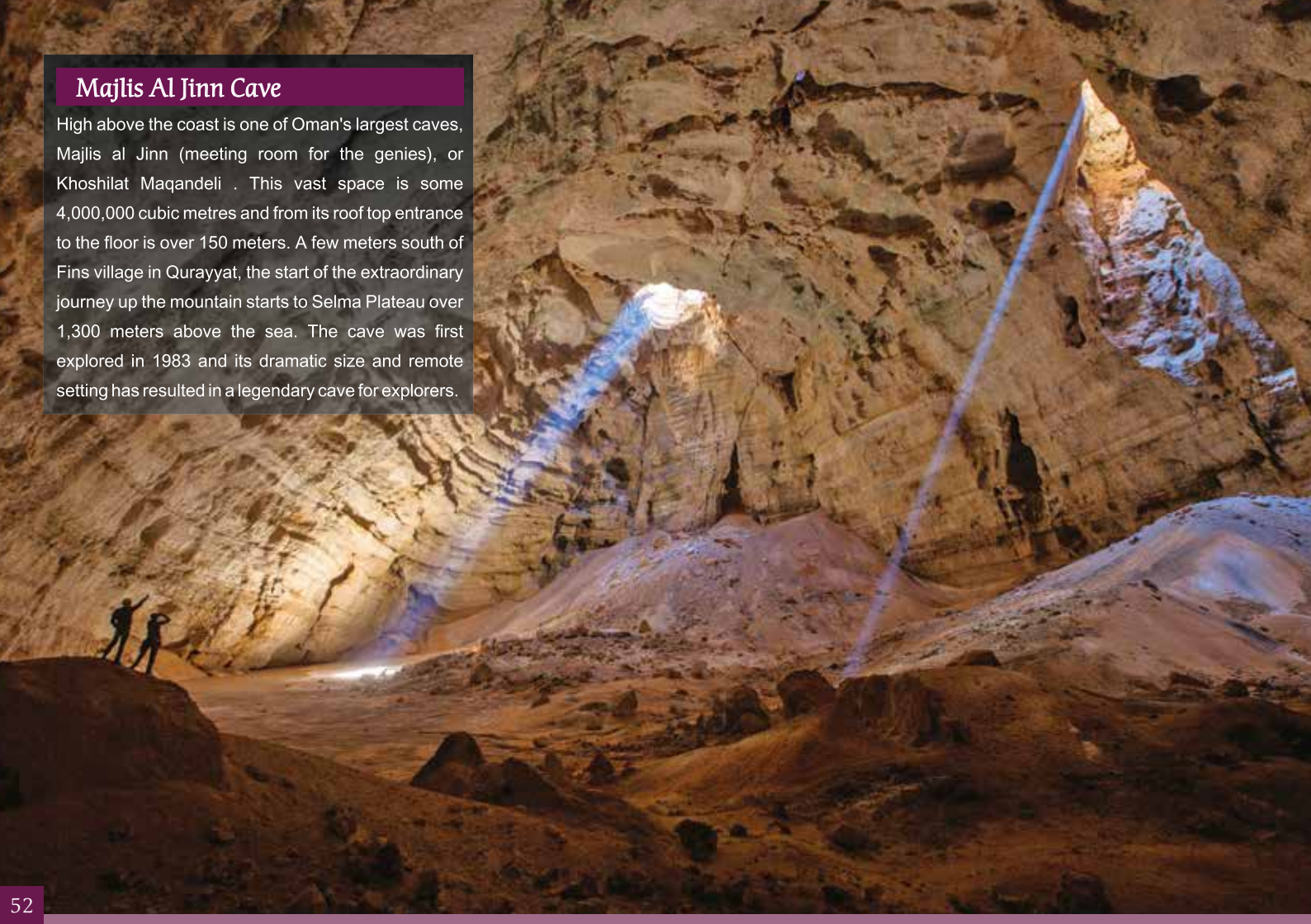


Mutrah Corniche

One of Oman's most attractive walks is along the Al Bahri Street between the Fish Souq in Matrah and the small community at Kalboo. Setting out from the Fish Souq one has excellent views of the white merchants houses of Sur Al Lawatia, which may be over 4 centuries old, and also the associated blue and white mosque. Overlooked by Matrah Fort, the small community at Mutayrah is set by a small lagoon whose sea exit passes underneath the Al Bahri Road, allowing passage to the fishing boats. From Mutayrah, the impressive mountains of ophiolite the upper part of the earth's mantle, dominate the route. Before the modern road was built, the sea pounded at their base, but land reclamation has also allowed a small linear park to be created. Overlooking the area the impressive white 'Incense Burner' is a landmark that is seen far out to sea. The road finally departs from the sea at the community of Kalboo, whose whitewashed housing overlooks the bay.

Majlis Al Jinn Cave

High above the coast is one of Oman's largest caves, Majlis al Jinn (meeting room for the genies), or Khoshilat Maqandeli . This vast space is some 4,000,000 cubic metres and from its roof top entrance to the floor is over 150 meters. A few meters south of Fins village in Qurayyat, the start of the extraordinary journey up the mountain starts to Selma Plateau over 1,300 meters above the sea. The cave was first explored in 1983 and its dramatic size and remote setting has resulted in a legendary cave for explorers.



Ras al Hamra

On a low headland just west of the Crowne Plaza Hotel is one of Muscat's most renowned archaeological sites, Ras al Hamra. Carbon dating has been used to establish the site's use at various periods following the middle of the 6th millennium BC. Archaeologists have excavated dwellings, stone tools, shell middens, hooks created from sea shells, and net sinkers used in fishing. The excavations were a precursor to much of the coastal archaeology in Oman and has remained one of the reference points of human habitation in the Arabian Peninsula.



Royal Opera House

The impressive, austere exterior of Oman's Royal Opera House conceals an interior that is opulent and yet superbly functional. The classically shaped auditorium has a seating capacity of just over 1,000, with all seats enjoying unobstructed views of the stage. The remarkable acoustics and relatively small size of the hall's space offers the audience an intimacy of experience which is unusual in today's comparably grand venues. Immerse yourself in this building and experience the power of performances from baroque chamber music to jazz fusion and more.





Folk dance

On the northern coast, especially around Muscat, a performance of praise called Al Malid takes place on religious occasions. A leader, called a 'Moualam', directs an ensemble of men as they chant words of praise and sway in unison while seated on the ground. This very charismatic performance requires constant practice, and makes an especially valuable contribution to Oman's cultural heritage.

Sailing

Sailing in the seas off Muscat offers not only the appeal of a variety of wind conditions, including summer trade winds and winter's more variable conditions, but also an impressive coast line as a backdrop. Two modern sailing centers will act as your base, The Wave and Marina Bandar Al Rowdha, one based on Muscat's open north west coastline, the other on the irregular cliffs of the south eastern coast. From dinghys, ideal to learn in through to 8 bed catamarans, the choice of water craft is yours.





Golf

Keep your eyes on the powdered white sand waiting in the bunkers, and focus on the line along the velvet greens when playing on a PGA-certified golf course in Muscat to understand the quality of the golf available for you.

Lift your eyes slightly towards the rugged mountains and over the open cityscape to appreciate that the city welcoming you is like no other. Golf in Muscat offers you quality and style with a welcome that is unique.

Tourism Guidelines

Dear Visitor:

In order to make your visit to Oman a perfect and unforgettable experience, we kindly ask that you observe the following guidelines closely.

General Guidelines

- Please observe the social customs of the Omani society and dress decently.
- Do not make any noise and keep music volume to a minimum when passing through the popular neighborhoods or residential areas.
- Do not photograph people when entering private properties without obtaining prior permission.
- Keep your environment clean. Dispose of litter or garbage in the designated dustbins.
- Make sure that your tour guide holds a valid license from the Ministry of Tourism.

When you visit any village, please:

- Protect the flora and fauna. Don't pick any fruits or vegetables as they are private property and a source of income for the locals.
- The Falaj system is the main source for drinking and irrigation water. Do not pollute it in any way.
- Stick to the specified trails at any tourist destination that you visit.
- Don't park or stop your vehicle in any place other than the designated parking space.

Cruises:

- Deal only with tourist boats licensed to do so, as they are equipped with the safety equipments prescribed by the law.

Visiting the Desert:

- Use a specialized tour guide. It's preferable to make the journey in more than one vehicle and to have GPS devices, along with the necessary safety means and equipments.
- Visiting hours for forts are subject to change.

Off-Road Travel:

- Use only 4WD vehicles and make sure you have adequate water, food, fuel and spare tyres. Check your 4WD system for proper functioning.
Inform a close friend of your destination and the expected date of your return.
- Don't camp in the Wadi beds. Flash floods can occur occasionally.

Trekking:

- When trekking in the mountain trails, choose suitable shoes and make sure you have enough food and water. Don't trek alone, and make sure you know about the roughness and length of such tracks beforehand.

General Instructions to visitors of handicrafts showrooms:

- 1- Don't touch or move any of the artifacts on display to avoid any damage.
- 2- Photography is allowed but without touching the exhibited items.
- 3- Don't leave children unattended and make sure they don't touch or move the displayed potteries so as not to be broken.
- 4- Do not dispose of litter or garbage inside the exhibited items.
- 5- The site is equipped with surveillance system to ensure the safety of the collection and to prevent theft.
- 6- Don't write, draw or put any stickers on the exhibited items.
- 7- While roaming, be careful not to hit any of the artifacts on display.
- 8- Use the proper shoes when you visit any archeological sites and avoid any wooden or tapered heel shoes that may cause erosion or damage to such sites.
- 9- Don't touch or take away any stones from the archeological sites.
